An Open Letter from USAID Staff

We are USAID personnel across different hiring mechanisms coming together from various professional and personal backgrounds. We are compelled to raise our collective voices and moral consciousness to urge USAID, the State Department, and the Biden Administration to join the growing calls, nationally and globally, for an immediate ceasefire between the State of Israel and Hamas.

As development, public health, and humanitarian assistance professionals, we are alarmed and disheartened at the numerous violations of international law; laws which aim to protect civilians, medical and media personnel, as well as schools, hospitals, and places of worship. At the time of writing, an alarming number of civilian deaths have been documented in the Gaza strip, and entire Palestinian families wiped off the civil registry. According to Save the Children, 3,197 children were killed in Gaza in just 3 weeks which supasses the annual number of children killed in conflict zones globally since 2019. The United Nations reports that the health system is on the brink of collapse. Twelve of Gaza's 35 hospitals are no longer functioning. Since the beginning of Israel's indiscriminate bombing campaign, the World Health Organization reports that there have been 34 attacks on healthcare facilities, including 21 hospitals; while 73 healthcare workers have been killed. Further, we are incredibly alarmed at the lack of functioning maternity and newborn units due to Israel's siege, and a growing number of pregnant women forced to undergo emergency C-sections without anesthetics. We are also deeply concerned about Israel's unlawful use of white phosphorus, documented by human rights organizations.

While we appreciate and acknowledge efforts by USAID to call for an urgent humanitarian response in Gaza and understand that the Agency is working tirelessly to make this happen, we must remember that humanitarian assistance efforts and life-saving aid are largely rendered moot in situations of escalating and indiscriminate bombing and violence. For USAID efforts to be effective and for lives to be saved, we need an immediate ceasefire and cessation of hostilities. We believe that further catastrophic loss of human life can only be avoided if the United States Government calls for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza, the release of Israeli hostages, and the restoration of water, food, fuel, and electricity to the people of Gaza by the State of Israel. In the longer term, we call on the United States Government to join the international community and human rights organizations in holding all

parties, including the State of Israel, to international law, which includes ending Israel's <u>illegal</u> <u>occupation</u> of the Palestinian territories and settlements on occupied land.

We join our colleagues and peers on Capitol Hill who have expressed <u>similar concerns</u>. Like them, we sign this letter anonymously out of concern for our personal safety and risk of potentially losing our jobs due to our plea for an immediate ceasefire and cessation of hostilities that, as <u>of November 6</u>, 2023, have now claimed the lives of more than 10.000 Palestinians and 1.400 Israelis.
