







LEVERAGING THE POWER OF HEALTH FINANCING FOR NCDs

The **Financing Accelerator Network for NCDs (FAN)** represents a significant step forward in addressing the critical shortfall in healthcare financing for noncommunicable diseases (NCDs), including cardiovascular disease, cancer, diabetes, chronic respiratory conditions, and mental and neurological disorders, in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs). This transformative initiative brings together Access Accelerated and the World Bank in a new technical partnership, working in close cooperation with Results for Development (R4D) to build a coalition of global and local organizations dedicated to supporting governments and local stakeholders build resilient healthcare financing systems, strengthen their NCD response, and drive on-the-ground impact.



OUR MISSION is to partner with governments and other stakeholders in LMICs to strengthen sustainable financing systems for NCDs, driving progress towards Sustainable Development Goal 3 (healthy lives and well-being for people at all ages) and ultimately ensuring equitable access to quality NCD prevention and care for everyone.

The need for change

- 41 million people die from NCDs every year
- 77% of NCD deaths occur in LMICs
- NCDs cost a projected USD47 trillion in healthcare expenditure and lost productivity (2010-2030)

Each year, noncommunicable diseases account for **41 million deaths** worldwide, with **77% of these deaths** occurring in LMICs. The economic burden is devastating, projected to reach **USD47 trillion** in healthcare costs and lost productivity from 2010 to 2030. Despite this reality, NCDs remain vastly underfunded, capturing less than **2%** of global health development assistance. Countries facing this burden often lack the essential resources, capacity, and support needed to effectively close the financing gap, which undermines their ability to respond to the NCD challenge, threatening individual health and national progress.

The FAN model

FAN operates through a network of regionally based NCD Financing Accelerators strategically positioned across Sub-Saharan Africa, Latin America & the Caribbean, and Asia Pacific. These regional accelerators serve as innovation hubs and catalysts for change, working closely with governments and local stakeholders to promote and scale sustainable, locally led, and people-centered NCD financing solutions. The first regional accelerator has been launched in Sub-Saharan Africa, hosted by the African Institute for Development Policy (AFIDEP).


